All 23 counties reported Meth., and alcohol are the most prevalent drugs listed by those interviewed. We have become desensitized to exposure to alcohol through commercials and social acceptance.

Agencies that bust clandestine labs are charged with spending \$7,000-50,000 to clean up. That affects whether law enforcement addresses the issues by raiding or targeting the access away from the lab.

PREV-NET- Natalie Freeman discussed the free curriculum “Too Good For Drugs” that the PREV-NET team offers for grades 4-12. The program is evidence-based, emphasizes social-emotional learning, and is comprised of (10) 45-minute lessons taught over a 10-week period. PREV-NET staff is qualified to train individuals who would like to teach the program or can come and implement it at your school or youth-serving organization. We have taught the program in public schools, juvenile probation offices, alternative schools, and after-school programs, but are flexible and open to new opportunities to serve in Morris County.
